This is one of the most substantial fundraisers for the APL. I run this alongside a good friend, who handles the logistics, while my role involves designing the annual shirt, creation of all marketing materials, website design, and week-of-event tasks. While it may sound small, I see people around Cleveland wearing one of the shirts at least once a week, and it's humbling to know the excitement it brings to around 1000 participants each year.

As a volunteer for *Best Buddies International of Ohio*, I help establish partnerships with local businesses to contribute to their annual walk. This year, we collaborated with Jukebox to serve a special "*Best Buddies Punch*," and with Cent's to serve two new pies, "*Besto*" and "*Buddy*," all of which brought in proceeds and awareness for the event. These collaborations were met with immeasurable excitement and our plan is to grow them with many more local businesses next year.

At my previous job, I initiated company-wide volunteer days that alternated between local organizations, some of which included May Dugan Center and St. Augustine Hunger Center.

Most recently, I began mentoring a sixth grade student at *Urban Community School* as part of their Wolfpack program. While I am new at this, my fellow mentors and I are excited to guide and grow with our wonderful student over the next few years.
