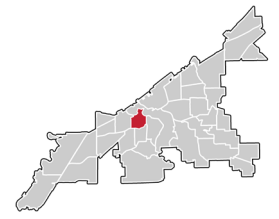

ESTIMATED AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY OF RESIDENTS

This estimate is a measure of how long a baby born in 2019 is, on average, expected to live. Estimates by sex and race were published in 2022 for Cuyahoga County, Ohio, and the U.S. The estimates were derived from population and death data from the National Center for Health Statistics. Local estimates were calculated based on the demographics of the residents of the geography.

REDLINING

Redlining was a discriminatory practice started in the 1930s, in which the government-supported Home Owners Loan Corporation and other entities identified specific neighborhoods that had large concentrations of Black residents as being too 'hazardous' to invest in.

This practice systematically denied home loans, disinvested in neighborhoods, and denied wealth building opportunities to Black families and other families of color, and certain parts of cities.

Although officially outlawed in 1968, the damage of these overtly racist policies is still felt to this day.

METHODOLOGY

These Fact Sheets were built using a method that was developed and refined in partnership between The Center for Community Solutions and Cleveland State University's Northern Ohio Data and Information Service. Publicly available data was apportioned into meaningful local geographies using weighted residential parcels and census tracts.

Neighborhoods are defined by statistical planning areas, which are developed by the Cleveland City Planning Commission.

The most recently available public data was always used when calculating estimates. There were occasionally data points where too few cases existed, and data had to be collapsed or suppressed. All data in these fact sheets must be interpreted as estimates, and there will always be some level of error built into large estimations of any data. To mitigate this, only reputable and reliable data sources were used.
